## Suit Blockages

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Declarer: & K3
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The $\$ 3$ on the right is a communication card allowing you to reach the A in Dummy.
Without it, the suit is blocked.

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Here, we are just going to focus on declarer-play blockages.
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You need to make sure that your $\star$ A gets used:

1. After the $\bullet$ AK have been played.
2. As an entry for cashing the ${ }^{\bullet} \mathrm{Q}$.

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After the lead, you do not have the time to establish the Q as an entry to Dummy's heart winners because the opponents will be able to cash at least 3 and the $A K$.

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You will take at most $1 \oplus, 2 \bullet, 4$ and $1 \$=8$ tricks, down 1 .

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In addition to 1 &, 4* and 2&, you have 3 top \ = 10 winners.
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In addition to $1 \boldsymbol{\$}, 4$ and $2 \$$, you have 3 top $=10$ winners.
However, if you play the $\odot \mathrm{K}$ and follow low from the dummy, unblocking the suit, you will have no way of getting back to the dummy to reach your 『AQ, so you will only take 8 tricks.

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However, if you play the $\odot \mathrm{K}$ and follow low from the dummy, unblocking the suit, you will have no way of getting back to the dummy to reach your "AQ, so you will only take 8 tricks.
Therefore, you must overtake the $\nabla_{K}$ with the ${ }^{\bullet}$ A in order to cash your ${ }^{\bullet} \mathrm{Q}$ for your ninth trick.
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## Ways of unblocking

- If the suit is not currently blocked but the high cards are split between the two hands in holdings of unequal length, play the top card from the shorter holding first.


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You cash the ${ }^{\bullet}$ A first to prevent the suit from getting blocked, which it would if you started by playing the ${ }^{\boldsymbol{*}} 3$ towards the ${ }^{\circ} \mathrm{KQ}$ J.

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The "top of the short" rule is a staple of good card play and should become second nature if it is not already.

- AK KQJT
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You cross to hand with the K and cash the $\mathrm{A}_{\mathrm{AK}}$ to unblock the suit.

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You cross to hand with the K and cash the $\triangle \mathrm{AK}$ to unblock the suit. Then, you cross back with the A to cash the ${ }^{\bullet} \mathrm{Q}$.

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e.g. AQJ
    \bulletK
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## e.g. AQJ <br> -K

You overtake the $『 \mathrm{~K}$ with the $\boxtimes \mathrm{A}$, which puts you in the correct hand for cashing the ${ }^{\bullet}$ Q without further manoeuvring required.

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You cash the AKQJT and then, on the fifth round of the suit, you can discard the $\triangle$ A to unblock that suit.

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e.g. A 5432
- KQJT AKQJT

You cash the AKQJT and then, on the fifth round of the suit, you can discard the $\triangle A$ to unblock that suit.
Then, you will be able to cash the $\because$ KQJT without being bounced into the wrong hand.
