•Planning after the Lead

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You should lead **your side's longest suit**. This does not necessarily correspond to your own long suit.

Remember that the aim is to produce length tricks once the opponents run out of cards in the suit. Unless you and your partner have at least 7, ideally 8, cards in the suit between you, this is unlikely to happen.

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♠: You have to lose 2 rounds of the suit before your fourth ♠ becomes a winner.

You might lose 1 round if the Q is on your left but will lose 0 rounds if it is on your right!

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(a) ▲ K2 ♥ AQ3 ♦ 53 ▲ JT8642
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In (a), you expect to gain the lead during the hand, which might give you time to establish your \clubsuit and then cash them.

In (b), you may or may not get in once more, at which point your \clubsuit are unlikely to be winners.

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The opponents have not looked for a major fit and you don't have **v** length... It looks very likely that your partner has **v** here!

Lead a **v** to establish your partner's suit.

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♥ AQ63 ♦ 9852

If the ♥K is on your right, you would like P to play a ♥ through the ♥K. A passive ♦ might be better instead.

• Passive vs. Active Defence

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In (a), leading a v and finding P with a key honour might be the only way of taking 3NT down when they often have a surplus of HCP.

In (b), they have shakily bid to 3NT: if you make them work for it, they might end up going down; you don't want to give them their ninth trick!

Declarer wins with the **K**.

Cards missing above the <6: A, 9. Therefore, the <6 cannot be fourthhighest and must be second-highest: <96xx.

Declarer plays the ♥2.

The ♥4 is the lowest possible spot: as fourth-highest, it must be from precisely 4 cards without a strong sequence: ♥ QJ54 at best.

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With P's ♥J, a ♥ seems to be right. Playing a ♦ is more appealing when P might hold ♥ J854.

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If you play the <a>4 on the first round, Declarer can block the suit by winning with the <a>A straightaway!

Unblock the *****K instead.

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In (a), the ♣ are running, so Declarer will make the contract easily unless P has a good ♥ holding such as ♥ AJTx. Switch to the ♥Q! In (b), the contract might be going down as long as you don't give anything away. Return a passive ♦.
